

MOTION OF NRC STAFF FOR
REVISION OF SCHEDULE

By Memorandum and Order dated December 23, 1985, the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board approved a schedule for this proceeding as follows:

January 24, 1986 - complete depositions;

February 3, 1986 - file written direct testimony;

February 13, 1986 - file any motions to strike testimony;

February 24, 1986 - file answers to motions to strike; and

March 10, 1986 - commence hearing.

The NRC staff and Kerr-McGee Chemical Corporation expect to have completed all depositions by January 24, 1986, except for the depositions of Staff witnesses Drs. Cool and Shum. Their depositions were originally scheduled for January 13 and 14, 1986, but had to be postponed due to their unavailability. Both Drs. Cool and Shum are intensively involved in Staff activities arising from an accident at the Sequoyah UF_6 conversion facility in Gore, Oklahoma that occurred on January 4, 1986. These demands on the time of Drs. Cool and Shum have necessitated the following proposed revision of the schedule:

February 14, 1986 - complete depositions;
February 24, 1986 - file written direct testimony;
March 6, 1986 - file any motions to strike testimony;
March 17, 1986 - file answers to motions to strike; and
March 31, 1986 - commence hearing.

Counsel for Kerr-McGee has reviewed this motion prior to its filing and indicated that Kerr-McGee has no objection to it. The Staff also advised counsel for the People of the State of Illinois of the relief requested and she indicated that the People have no objection to it. Accordingly, the Staff respectfully requests the Licensing Board to revise the schedule for this proceeding as set forth above.
