

Stoughton in a ready to use form from a Nuclear Pharmacy.

of free technetium-99M (approximately 100mCi) to be used to  
prepare reagent kits for use in case there are any

equipment and radioactive materials.

## CONDITIONS

9. Authorized use. (Unless otherwise specified, the authorized place of use is the licensee's address stated in Item 2 above.)
- A. Any diagnostic procedure listed in Groups I, II, and III, as found in the State Sanitary Code, Chapter I, Part 16, Appendix I, Table 8, "Groups of Medical Uses of Radioactive Material" and any diagnostic procedure added to Groups I, II, and III by notification issued by the New York State Department of Health for which adequate radiation detection instrumentation is available.
- B. and C. Calibration and check sources.
10. Radioactive material shall be used by, or under the tutelage of, Edward D. Feinstein, M.D.
11. Except as specifically provided otherwise by this license, the licensee shall possess and use radioactive material described in Items 6, 7, and 8 of this license in accordance with statements, representations, and procedures contained in the following: Application for New York State Radioactive Materials License dated March 10, 1975, signed by Dr. Edward D. Feinstein, and letter dated June 8, 1978, signed by Dr. Edward D. Feinstein. The above referenced documents are a part of this license and shall be maintained with it.
12. Sealed sources containing radioactive material shall not be opened.
13. Radioactive material shall be stored in a locked facility in the original shipping container, or a container providing equivalent radiation protection. Such a facility may be a cabinet, a safe, or a room providing the facility is locked at all times when no activities are in progress relating to the use of the radioactive material.
14. The use of radioactive material on the premises of an institution which has a radioactive materials committee shall be coordinated with, and approved by, that committee.
15. The licensee shall have available an appropriate survey meter which shall be maintained operational and calibrated a minimum of once every 12 months. Records of all calibrations shall be kept a minimum of 3 years.
16. Except as otherwise specifically provided by this license, radioactive material to be administered to human beings shall be procured in prepackaged, precalibrated form from a supplier who manufactures or repackages the product under appropriate pharmaceutical controls related to assay, identity, quality, purity, sterility, and nonpyrogenicity.
17. A. Biological products labeled with radionuclides or kits used to prepare such products shall be procured from a supplier who holds an unsuspended or unrevoked license issued by the Secretary, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare to propagate, manufacture, prepare, label, or distribute the products.

## CONDITIONS

17. B. Radiopharmaceuticals and kits used to prepare radiopharmaceuticals, other than biological products, shall be procured from a supplier who holds an approved New Drug Application from the Secretary, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.
18. A. Technetium 99m pertechnetate shall be procured in prepackaged, precalibrated form from a supplier who manufactures or repackages the product under appropriate pharmaceutical controls related to assay, identity, quality, purity, sterility, and nonpyrogenicity.
- B. Notwithstanding the foregoing requirements, Technetium 99m pertechnetate may be eluted and prepared from a Molybdenum 99/Technetium 99m sterile generator in accordance with the supplier's procedures. Any Molybdenum 99/Technetium 99m generator procured from a supplier who holds an approved New Drug Application for distribution issued by the Secretary, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare and licensed for distribution by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission or an Agreement State may be used.
- C. The licensee shall perform all contamination and/or impurity tests required by the manufacturer's instructions.
- D. Technetium 99m eluate shall not be used in human beings if the Molybdenum 99 contamination is in excess of either:
- 1) one microcurie per one millicurie of Technetium 99m, or,
  - 2) a total of five microcuries per administered dose of Technetium 99m.
- E. The Molybdenum 99/Technetium 99m generator column may be disposed of as ordinary trash when a radiation survey of the unshielded column indicates no activity above background.



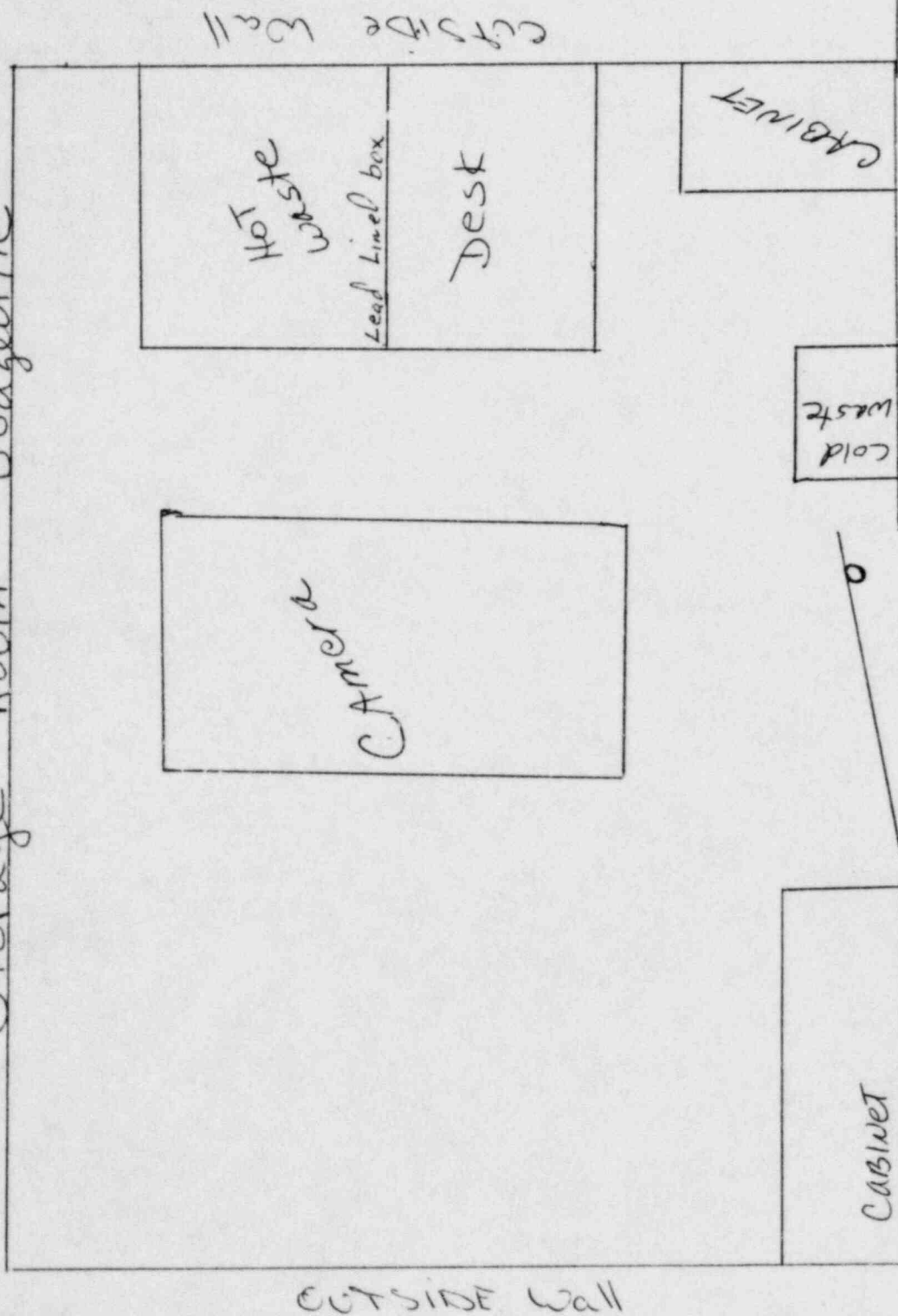
