Dear Mr. Thorne:

I wish to refer to your letter of November 14, 1985, regarding applications from Braunkohle Transport USA for amendments to export licence XU 8586 from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to export nuclear material to countries in the Euratom Community. The amendments would extend the license to cover possible exports to ASEA-Atom AB, Västerås, Sweden for fuel fabrication (amendment 01) and to Sydkraft AB, Malmö, Sweden, for end use of light water reactor fuel (amendment 02).

The material identified in the license applications will be subject to all terms and conditions of the Agreement for Cooperation, which entered into force on April 11, 1984, concerning the civil uses of atomic energy between the Government of Sweden and the Government of the United States.

ASEA-Atom AB and Sydkraft AB are authorized to receive and possess the material.

I would appreciate receiving a copy of the export license when it has been amended.
