I, Richard L. Bryant, being duly sworn according to law,  
depose and say as follows:

1. My name is Richard L. Bryant. I am the Director of  
the Burke County Emergency Management Agency. My business ad-  
dress is Route 2, Box 51B, Waynesboro, Georgia 30830. A summa-  
ry of my professional qualifications is attached to this affi-  
davit as Exhibit A.

2. The purpose of this affidavit is to support "Appli-  
cants' Motion For Summary Disposition of Joint Intervenors'  
Contention EP-2/EP-2(a)," which concerns the existence of ad-  
ministrative controls over use of the Emergency Notification

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
Network ("ENN"). I have personal knowledge of the matters set forth herein and believe them to be true and correct.

3. Burke County will have one ENN terminal, which will be located on the central dispatcher's console in the Burke County Emergency Operations Center ("EOC"). Because that console will be staffed 24 hours per day, physical access to the ENN terminal will be restricted.


4. In addition, Burke County's ENN terminal will be subject to strict administrative controls. By procedure, use of the ENN will be limited to the transmission of official and necessary messages, such as information about the date and time of an incident, the class of emergency, whether a release is taking place, the type of actual or projected release and estimated duration/impact times, estimates of quantity, points and heights of radioactive releases, the chemical and physical form of releases, meteorological conditions, actual or projected dose rates and integrated doses, estimates of any surface radioactive contamination, emergency response actions underway, potentially affected populations and areas, any recommended emergency actions (including protective measures), requests for any needed onsite support by offsite organizations, and the prognosis for the event based on plant information.

5. In summary, the Burke County ENN terminal will be both physically and administratively controlled. The physical controls will prevent unauthorized access to the ENN. The

administrative controls will assure its ready availability during an emergency for the transmission of official and necessary messages.

Exhibit A

RICHARD L. BRYANT

DIRECTOR, Burke County Emergency Management Agency

Since 1984, Mr. Bryant has served as the Director of the Burke County Emergency Management Agency (EMA), with headquarters located in Waynesboro, Georgia. Mr. Bryant is the first full-time director of the agency which, under his leadership, has experienced significant growth and expansion of its resources and capabilities.

As Director, Mr. Bryant has responsibility for fire, rescue, and ambulance services on a county-wide basis, as well as responsibility for planning and implementing the response to the full range of natural and technological disasters potentially affecting Burke County. He supervises a paid staff of approximately 30 people, as well as more than 50 volunteers.

He assumed the lead in obtaining funding for Burke County's recently constructed Emergency Operations Center (EOC), and -- with the cooperation of the local agencies involved in EOC development -- he managed the planning efforts involved in its design. These efforts included the development of the overall layout of the facility and its equipment.

Mr. Bryant has completed numerous professional development courses offered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. These have included courses in emergency management planning and decision-making, personnel management, finance and budgeting, shelter management, and radiological procedures and methodologies. Mr. Bryant has also completed several courses with the Georgia Emergency Management Agency, including such topics as rescue, hazardous materials transportation accidents, and arson investigation.

PRIOR EXPERIENCE

For twenty-three years prior to assuming the Directorship of the Burke County Emergency Management Agency, Mr. Bryant was a Flight Engineer with the operations branch of the United States Air Force, specializing in planning and scheduling. He had responsibilities in emergency planning areas, including emergency response to conventional and nuclear warfare, and hazardous materials issues and problems. These responsibilities included leading emergency response teams for hazardous materials emergencies, as well as supervising programs for routine and emergency handling and disposal of radioactive materials. Mr. Bryant's duties also included tactical operations and contingency planning.
