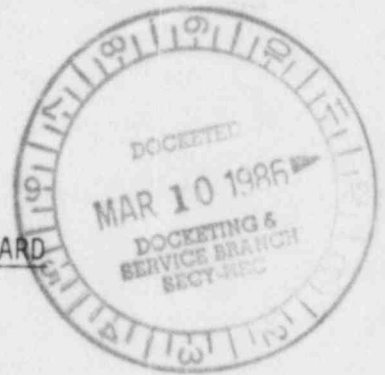

and say as follows:




3. When published, the "Vogtle Electric Generating Plant Site Specific Radiological Emergency Response Plan, Part 7, SCORERP" ("South Carolina Plan") will identify Aiken Community Hospital (in Aiken, South Carolina) and Humana Hospital (in Augusta, Georgia) as the medical facilities in the vicinity of Plant Vogtle for the treatment of any members of the general public in South Carolina who might be contaminated and injured as a result of an accident at the plant. See South Carolina Plan, Annex C.

4. The South Carolina Plan thus identifies medical services facilities with the technical capability to treat contaminated, injured members of the general public, in compliance with 10 C.F.R. § 50.47 (b) (12).
