
Dear Mr. Brinkman:

Attached are certificates and letters of transfer from Pyrotronics, Inc. certifying to the qualification of eight (8) additional of our personnel to handle and install the Pyrotronics fire detection device called Pyr-A-Larm and containing Americium 241, as covered by our License GL-241(C67). Personnel covered are: Robert B. Blaesing, Maurise L. Bezilli, Clinton L. Clark, Karl H. Fricke, Kenneth Kanta, E. J. Kilper, Everett McLain, and Ernest Mirgain. This brings to a total of 11 of our employees who have met the qualifications.

Subsequent to the issuing of our license GL-241 we have had inquiries from two or three agreement states relative to our activities in that area. I have informed them that we have not and do not intend to deal in these fire detection devices at any location outside of our own St. Louis location.

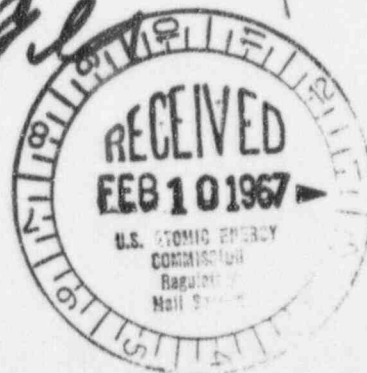
