On October 16, 1985, this office submitted to you "Response of Sequoyah Fuels Corporation to Petitions Concerning the Proposed UF₆-to-UF₄ Conversion Facility." This submittal was in response to your Memorandum and Order dated September 26, 1985.

The attached is a revised Table 17 to the submittal referenced above. This revision corrects an error concerning the amount of calcium fluoride sludge generated by the proposed facility. The amount of sludge is 1,390 cubic feet per year and not 3,330 cubic feet. Copies have been submitted to all on the service list.

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
