Dear Mr. Brinkman:

Mr. L. C. Weger, who in the past has handled many details pertaining to Monsanto's AEC licenses including revisions, etc., here at our Research Center at St. Louis, is presently ill and will be away from his duties for an extended period of time. In his absence, it is my responsibility to see that our licenses are kept current.

The question I have some uncertainty about concerns our Byproduct Material License No. 24-1113-8. I find that under Amendment No. 2 (G65), the expiration date is July 31, 1965. To this license a third amendment was made which included the addition of Messrs. Koerner and Levy as licensees and increased the amounts of items "C" through "H" from 10 millicuries authorized to 75 millicuries. This amendment No. 3 (G67) has an expiration date of July 31, 1967. Is the 1967 expiration date now all inclusive? Is our Byproduct Materials license No. 24-1113-8 now in good order until July 31, 1967, or is there any action on our part necessary in complying with Amendment No. 2 with an expiration date of July 31, 1965?

A second question I would ask of you concerns disposal or donation of our instruments to other organizations using sources now covered under our license. If we should dispose of an instrument, what action will be necessary on our part to amend our existing license and, if given to another organization, must they be licensed or have licenses amended prior to receiving the instrument?

Your immediate consideration to these questions will be greatly appreciated.
