

SUBJECT: Violation of License #5-46-13, License Conditions  
7 and 9.

1. During the recent AEC inspection of 8, 11, 13 July 1966 the FGH Radioisotope Clinic was found to have procured and used Macro-aggregated Radioiodinated Human Serum Albumin for detection of pulmonary embolus. The Fitzsimons General Hospital was in unknowing violation of the license #5-46-13 conditions 7 and 9 as described by the AEC.

2. When we were made aware of the violation, use of Macro-aggregated Human Serum Albumin was stopped. On 2 August 66 an amendment to permit us to use MAAC was submitted through Army Channels to the Atomic Energy Commission.
