<p>5. The following activities under your license (identified in Item No. 3 above) appear to be in noncompliance with AEC regulations or license requirements, as indicated.</p> <p>a. During the period July, 1966, to February 16, 1968, strontium 85, in the form of nitrate, for use in bone scans was procured and possessed in quantities up to 2.0 millicuries. This is contrary to License Item 8.Y., which restricts the maximum authorized possession of this isotope for the above use to 1.0 millicurie.</p> <p>b. On November 18, 1967, 15 microcuries of cesium 137, in liquid form, was procured and used in the radioisotope clinic. This is contrary to License Items 6.AA. and 9.AA., which only authorize possession and use of this isotope for research studies in the U. S. Army Medical Research and Nutrition laboratory.</p>
