Re: Corrective Action vis a vis Inspection Report No. 99990001/85-26.

Dear Mr. Kinneman:

Effective January 1, 1985, Swiss Watch Technical Center formerly located in Lititz, Pa., no longer occupied or conducted any type of operation(s) in the facility visited by your inspector Marlene J. Taylor on August 20, 1985. During the eight month period beginning in January, there was at no time any occupancy in the building or usage of the testing device Micro Derm MD-3 or its companion PS-10 probe system. Our company has no intention of utilizing the equipment; consequently, the manufacturer, UPA Technology Inc. of Syosset, NY has been contacted informing them of our interest to sell the complete unit less the radioactive source.

Under the guise of the manufacturer the isotope(s) used with the PS-10 probe system is currently being processed for return shipment in a protective enclosure to their New York facility. The material shall be returned no later than October 21, 1985.

Upon your receipt of this letter, the MD-3 meter and the PS-10 probe system less the radioactive source is to be sold. Having taken this corrective action, the current violation should become rectified predicated on the fact that UPA Technology Inc. who would routinely conduct the required periodic leak testing is to become the permanent possessor of the source material(s).

It is our intention to adhere to the NRC's regulations and through the aforementioned corrective procedure(s), hope to satisfy your request(s) and regain our status in full compliance.
