SUBJECT: DRAFT SAFETY EVALUATION ON THE PROCEDURE GENERATION PACKAGE FOR  
MILLSTONE UNIT 2

Enclosed is a Draft Safety Evaluation on the Procedure Generation Package (PGP) for Millstone 2. The PGP was submitted with your letter of September 1, 1983 and Revision 1 to the PGP along with additional information was submitted for our review with your letter of January 30, 1985.

At this time, we do not have sufficient information to approve your submittal. We require that all reactor operators exercise the Emergency Operating Procedure (EOP) on the training simulator prior to the implementation of the EOP. Unless you have adequate justification for not including this in your PGP, we request that a revised PGP be submitted which includes this provision. Also, we need a submittal comparing the actual instrumentation and controls in the Millstone 2 control room with those instrumentation and controls identified by the Combustion Engineering Owners Group (CEOG) as necessary for the reactor operator to perform the EOP. We understand that the reactor operator's informational and control needs are part of the function and task analysis being done as part of the DCRDR for Millstone 2. Prior to issuing a final Safety Evaluation on the PGP, we will need to review this function and task analysis. Further details of these requirements are contained in the enclosed Draft Safety Evaluation. This evaluation was performed with the assistance of personnel from Battelle Pacific Northwest Laboratories.

Within 20 days from receipt of this letter, we request that you provide a schedule for supplying the requested items.

The information requested in this letter affects fewer than 10 respondents; therefore, OMB clearance is not required under P.L. 96-511.
