

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN THE  
UNITED STATES NAVY  
AND THE  
UNITED STATES NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to define the working relationship between the United States Navy (USN) and the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for the conduct of services regarding nuclear-powered warships.

2. POLICY

The USN will request services from NRC by official letter signed by the Deputy Director, Operations, Plans, and Political Military Affairs (N31B/N52B), or equivalent. In short-notice situations, the USN may send the official letter to NRC via secure facsimile. NRC will perform the services requested and respond to the USN via letter. Classification of all correspondence will be in accordance with CG-RN-1 classification guidance.

3. FUNDING

The USN will obligate money for NRC services at the beginning of each fiscal year and will provide a copy of the required funding obligations to NRC after October 1, 1996, but before any work is performed by NRC for the fiscal year. For each fiscal year thereafter, the USN will continue to provide the required fiscal information in the same manner. For fiscal year 1997, NRC will charge a flat rate of \$356.00 for each service performed. This rate will be evaluated annually by NRC, and the Director of the Non-Power Reactors and Decommissioning Project Directorate will inform the USN of any changes required to the service charges on or before May 1 of each year. The adjusted service charge will be an appendix to this MOU. NRC will bill the USN at the end of each quarter for the services performed. NRC bills will be sent to the following address:

NRC bills will contain the billing period dates, the number of services performed, the NRC flat rate charge per service, and a total bill.

#### 4. RESPONSIBILITIES

Both the USN and NRC will designate an office or a division to function as the agency's point of contact to resolve particular problems of policy matters pertaining to NRC reviews. These points of contact will consult with and obtain the concurrence of affected elements within their organizations in accordance with internal requirements and responsibilities. The USN and NRC have designated the following office or division to serve this purpose.

This MOU shall become effective on October 1, 1996. It shall remain in effect until terminated.

7. AMENDMENTS

This MOU may be modified or amended by written agreement between the USN and NRC.

8. TERMINATION

This MOU may be terminated by the mutual agreement of the USN and NRC or by either party upon 30 days' written notice to the other.
