

I would appreciate it very much if you could send me a list of the violations of the Hatch Plant which are recorded by the Nuclear Regulatory Agency in Washington.

Do you think that the control over the development of Nuclear plants is adequate?

I look forward to hearing from you. I am especially interested in the plant at Baxley for it is located about two miles from the place where I was born.
