Enclosure 1 contains the Westinghouse response to NRC requests for additional information on AP600. Specifically, responses are provided for the following RAIs:

By responding to the above mentioned RAIs related to the seismic margin analysis, Westinghouse believes DSER Open Item 19.1.3.2-1 is closed. This is item #1425 in the OITS.

Also note that submittal of the responses to NRC questions on the in-vessel steam explosion evaluation (via Westinghouse letter DCP/NRC0915, dated June 13, 1997) closes, from the Westinghouse perspective, DSER open item 19.2.3.3-5 (OITS #1464).

These responses close, from the Westinghouse perspective, the RAIs and DSER open items. The Westinghouse status column in the OITS will be changed to "Action N," except for OITS #5291 whose status will be changed to "Confirm-N." The NRC should review these responses and inform Westinghouse of the status to be designated in the "NRC Status" column of the OITS.


The Westinghouse Electric Corporation copyright notice, proprietary information notice, application for withholding and affidavit are also attached.
