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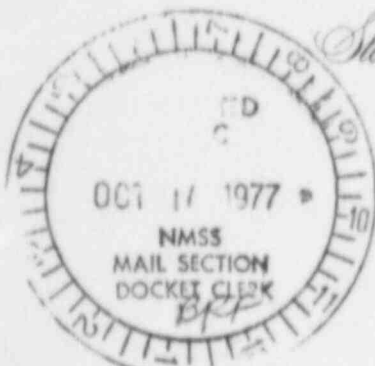

On June 15, 1976, an annual inspection stop was made at Kerr-McGee's Sequoyah facility near Gore, Oklahoma. After touring the facility with Mr. Charles Grosclaude, a discussion was held with Mr. Grosclaude in an effort to determine any new processes which would increase any air contaminants from the Sequoyah facility. Mr. Grosclaude stated that no new processes had been added which would contribute to an increase in air pollution from this facility. The submerged combustion chamber in the lower pond is now only used intermittently as the levels of the ponds are quite sufficient at this time. Mr. Grosclaude stated that the Sequoyah facility is contemplating an increase in production and have applied for a permit to construct from the Atomic Energy Commission. We reminded Mr. Grosclaude that if any of the new construction was to effect air quality, permitting for the operation would be required and they should check with our Department to determine the need for this permitting. The increase in production is not expected until sometime in 1978.
