

Dear Sir:

Thank you for the copy of the "Amendment to 10CFR21".

I would like to express my opinion of this document.

First of all, I wish to state that I am not a well educated man and therefore may not fully understand the intent. Your regulation even though the purchase order to the mill may spell out "nuclear" in big letters, would excuse the mill, but not the small manufacturer.


