In response to the letter dated September 8, 1978, from Robert O. McClintock, Chief, Materials Radiological Protection Section, indicating two items of deficiency found at the time of our recent inspection, we would like to make the following amendments to our license #06-00843-03.

1. We amend our Isotope Committee Membership to exclude Richard A. Rielly, Associate Vice-President and to include Raymond E. Grandchamp, Associate Vice-President. Mr. Grandchamp's curriculum vitae is attached.
2. We amend our license to read St. Vincent's Medical Center, 2800 Main Street, Bridgeport, CT, 06606 instead of St. Vincent's Hospital, 2820 Main Street, Bridgeport, CT, 06606.
3. We amend our list of users as listed in Condition 12 of our license to include Robert D. Russo, Jr., M. D. and Ralph W. Romano, M. D. for full user privileges. Each curriculum vitae is attached.
4. We plan to revise our package opening procedure to conform to the enclosed "Radioactive Shipment Receipt Report" based on Appendix F of NUREG-0338, Revision 1.
5. We will maintain a record of the actual count of sealed sources before and after use in all patients. We will maintain a routine quarterly inventory of sealed sources. We will conduct semi-annual leak tests. All these records will be maintained and are in compliance with Item #13 of our letter of May 21, 1976.
