NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION  
BEFORE THE ATOMIC SAFETY AND LICENSING BOARD  
PETITION TO INTERVENE BY CHARLES MICHULKA, ESQ.

In accordance with the Sept. 11, 1978 FR notice concerning the Allens Creek power plant, I wish to petition to be allowed to intervene as a party in the construction permit hearings.

I live and work near Stafford, Texas which is southwest of Houston, Texas, and about 20 miles from the location of the proposed plant. I work in the City Hall of Stafford which is located on a U.S. highway, Rt. 90, upon which nuclear waste may be carried. I am especially interested in seeing that no one is exposed to radiation from this plant since new information indicates that even low levels of radiation can cause cancer or genetic damage. Recent newspaper articles have reported transportation accidents in which the "unbreakable" containers were broken. I only recently learned that USSR had a large nuclear accident in which many people were killed and large areas of the country were "off limits" to the people because of the radiation dangers. Our own countries experts have indicated that an accident near a city such as Houston could kill over 100,000. within a short time, and the city would have to be abandoned for many years.

I have become aware that the Houston L & P Co. has ask for a large rate increase much of which is claimed to be necessary to pay for nuclear plants under construction. The South Texas plant has experienced a huge cost overrun and delay in completion. I am concerned what effect this plant will have on my electric bills. Please send me a copy of the final EIS.
