Dear Mr. Carns:

In accordance with your request of September 15, 1987, to discontinue Outfall 003, you are hereby notified that we have eliminated this Outfall from your National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit.

Any resumption of the discharge or any new discharge from this Outfall without a permit will be unlawful. Should you again propose to discharge any pollutants to the waters of the United States from this outfall or make other modifications to your permit, it may be necessary to file a new application at least 180 days in advance of the proposed discharge. Any permit issued as a result of such reapplication will contain conditions and limitations consistent with the situation, and the law and the regulations in effect at the time of reissuance, irrespective of any previously issued permit.
