Dear Mr. Cain:

In reference to your letter to Mr. John Owen Yale, Administrator; Sheridan County Memorial Hospital, dated 9-16-87, one paragraph refers to the preceptor statement for Dr. Matthews to be added to the license. You asked for the preceptor's statement to be amended to clearly specify the number of hours of supervised worked experience and supervised clinical experience. Supervised work experience and supervised clinical experience were obtained from 1972 through 1982 full time and from 1982 through 1987, part time. Dr. Matthews received 550 hours of supervised work experience and clinical experience over the years 1972 to 1982 and 100 hours of experience from 1982 through 1987 for a total of 650 hours.

I hope this satisfies your question asked in your letter 9-16-87 to Mr. Yale. If further information is desired, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I have viewed video tapes put out by the R.S.N.A. entitled "Nuclear Accident" as well as a second video tape entitled "Myocardial and Infarct Imaging" by Dr. James H. Thrall.

I have also viewed the videotape "Use of Radionuclide Scanning in the Evaluation of Coronary Artery Disease" put out by Radsat.

I also have read some articles in the American Journal of Cardiology concerning the usefulness of oral Dipyridamole suspension for stress thallium imaging without exercise in the detection of coronary artery disease.

Concerning my activities and experience in nuclear medicine during the past five years, I have been doing the nuclear medicine studies for Johnson County Memorial Hospital utilizing Sheridan County Memorial Hospital equipment. I have been interpreting these studies under the supervision of Dr. Fred Lindemann. In addition, I have done some locum tenens work for Dr. A. Wills in Worland, Wyoming and assisted him in interpreting the nuclear medicine studies during the time at which I was there. I have continually been involved in the field of nuclear medicine on nearly a daily basis in the last five years.

Dear Mr. Yale:

In regards to the current state of affairs with the addition of my name to the Isotope License, I would put forth the following information. From the recent conversation between Dr. Matthews, myself and Mr. Cain on the phone, I believe I understand the materials which are now lacking.

I spoke with Dr. Wilson in Denver who was one of my preceptors during my training. He stated that he and Dr. Wenzel, the other preceptor, would send forthwith a revision to the preceptor statement. In particular, the second page of NRC Form 313M Supplement B, #3; where they expressed that I had nine months experience will be broken down to more readily comply with the NRC language. From speaking with Dr. Wilson, the amount of training as specified in Regulation 35.91 and 35.92 is easily covered in three months of training. My degree of training was in excess of six months over this.

Again, I would think this letter would be in Mr. Cain's possession my midweek.

Attached you will also find three certificates for 82 hours of Category I CME credits as approved by the American Medical Association. Eighteen hours of this credit were specifically related to Nuclear Medicine. This morning I received one hour of CME credit as approved through the hospital for attending a lecture on Radiation Enteritis as given by Dr. Deigert.

I have subscribed to Radiology during the past five years and read the information in this journal devoted to Nuclear Medicine. Although I do not subscribe to The Journal of Nuclear Medicine I have in the past five years accessed this journal in my work. I have read the book entitled Essentials of Nuclear Medicine by M. V. Merrick.

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
I have viewed many videotapes relating to Nuclear Medicine, particularly those produced by Radsat, the last title which comes to mind was as Dr. Matthews stated, on the use of radionuclide imaging in the evaluation of coronary artery disease.

During the past five years I have done nuclear medicine studies at Memorial Hospital of Sheridan County with its equipment. Approximately one-third of the total work done in this hospital during the past five years has had my involvement. Additionally, I have worked locum tenens for Dr. Aubrey Wills in Worland, Wyoming and am quite familiar with their equipment and have worked with him in a number of studies.

The use and interpretation of radionuclide scanning is a very integral part of diagnostic radiology and during the past five years has almost been a daily occurrence for me.
