Mr. Gleason:

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff has reviewed the Bruker Detection Corporation (Bruker) amendment request dated April 16, 2020 and determined that additional information is needed. In order to continue with our review, please address the issues listed below. This information is required by Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Section 32, and described in the relevant guidance document NUREG-1556, Volume 3, titled "Applications for Sealed Source and Device Evaluation and Registration."

In your April 16, 2020, letter requesting an amendment to exempt device registration no. NR-1101-D-102-E to include the Water Chemistry RAID-M 100 model, you note that "the label with the new model name and part number is currently under development." Per 10 CFR 32.26 and 32.29, please provide a picture or drawing with the final label to include the final part number. Additionally, please verify that the method of attachment, dimensions, materials, and location of the label remain the same or, if not, provide details on any changes.

Please confirm receipt of this email and submit the requested information within 30 calendar days of the date of this email. If we have not received the complete information within 30 days, we will consider your amendment request as having been abandoned by you. This is without prejudice to the submission of a complete new amendment request.
