Dear Mr. Makrides,

Could you please reply to this email to confirm receipt?

This is in reference to your letter dated May 26, 2020, requesting to amend NRC License No. 06-06941-01. We have reviewed your previously voided amendment request under Mail Control No. 612668 and have found similar deficiencies in this request. Please note the NRC has published guidance for adding Authorized Medical Physicist to NRC licenses, this can be found in Appendix C of NUREG-1556, Volume 9, Revision 3, "Program-Specific Guidance About Medical Use Licenses,". The guidance can be located at the following address: <https://www.nrc.gov/docs/ML1925/ML19256C219.pdf>. Additionally, the NRC has published an updated NRC FORM 313A which provides a template for the required information. The updated forms can be located at the following address: <https://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/forms/>. In order to continue our review, please provide the following additional information:

1. Please provide the requested material and use for which you wish to list Mr. Lin as an authorized medical physicist (AMP).
2. Please provide a description of the training and experience demonstrating that the proposed AMP is qualified by the training and experience identified in 10 CFR 35.51 for the unit requested. In particular, please provide the following documentation:
  - a. A Diploma showing a master's or doctor's degree in physics, medical physics, other physical science, engineering, or applied mathematics from an accredited college or university;
  - b. Evidence of 1 year of full-time training in medical physics including the training syllabus and curriculum, textbooks used, etc.;
  - c. Evidence of **an additional year** of full-time work experience under the supervision of an individual who meets the requirements for an authorized medical physicist for the type of use for which the individual is seeking authorization; and
  - d. A copy of the NRC or Agreement State license or permit listing Dr. Lin's supervising medical physicist as an AMP.

3. On the "Norwalk HDR-IVRT Topic" check list please list the names of the trainers and the dates the training.
4. Please provide a written attestation, signed by a preceptor AMP, that the proposed AMP has satisfactorily completed the training and experience required in 10 CFR 35.51(b)(1), as well as the training in 10 CFR 35.51(c) for the types of use specified, and that the individual is able to independently fulfill the radiation safety-related duties as an AMP for each type of therapeutic medical unit for which the individual is requesting authorized medical physicist status.
