Topic: Impact of continued construction of Pacific powerlines.

Topic: Erosion impact of further construction of powerlines.

(6) A witness, yet to be named, on geothermal resources as a viable timely alternative to power generation at Diablo Canyon.


(7) Ian McMillan, rancher. A principal intervenor in the Diablo Canyon Units 1 and 2 construction permit hearings.
