Freedom of Information Act Request

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To Whom It May Concern:

I am seeking access to records under the Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act.

I am requesting records of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (and the agency known previously as the Atomic Energy Commission) as they pertain to a previous employee of the agency.

The request pertains to all records involving Edwin George Triner (DOB: (b) (6)). I am requesting:

-employment and work records

-records of any positions, titles or employment obligations

- records of meetings involving Edwin G. Triner, interactions with private entities in official capacity as a representative of the NRC, promotions or other changes in his employment role at the Nuclear Regulatory Commission

-any other records of the agency that might cite, involve or discuss mention of Edwin George Triner in any form.

-NRC work products composed by, to or for Edwin G. Triner

-any and all other records mentioning or involving Edwin G. Triner in any capacity

Edwin G. Triner was previously the NRC director of program analysis (1975)

As his grandson, he has stated his permission for me to request these records. If it is necessary to obtain his formal authorization for these records, it is conceivably possible to do so, however, the burden in doing so should be noted. He is about to turn (b) (6). Both traveling for notarized documentation as well as waiting for his life to end would pose burdensome requirements on the subject as well as our family. It could also significantly delay the processing of the request. If there is any way to obtain these records without doing so, it would be greatly helpful to the health of the subject as well as other next of kin seeking to obtain the records. I would be willing to personally visit the Nuclear Regulatory Commission with next of kin and proper identification if it would be at all useful in locating or obtaining the requested records. If there is any other way of obtaining the records without such requirements, I would be willing to adhere to any requests set forth by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in order to successfully obtain the records associated with this request.

If such records exist in electronic format, I am willing to accept the records in said format. If they do not exist in any electronic format, hardcopy is a perfectly acceptable format.

I am willing to pay the applicable fees, if any, associated with processing of this request.

If you require any further information in order to properly identify or obtain the requested records, please let me know. Thank you very much for your consideration in this matter.
