I just learned from Assemblywoman Galef that NRC oversight for Indian Point, among other sites, will be reduced. The is terrifying for someone living within 10 miles of the enormous stores of deadly nuclear waste.

Holtec has no motivation to bear the expenses necessary to ensure our safety. On the contrary, their commitment to their shareholders is to maximize profits by minimizing costs. Only the NRC stands between us and a potential life-threatening and property destroying catastrophe brought on by excessive cost cutting by Holtec.
