Enclosed is Amendment No. 28 to Radiopharmacy Incorporated's (your) U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 13-26246-01MD in accordance with your August 5, 2022 request to update the facility diagram for the location of use listed on your license, including to remove previously authorized areas of use. Your letter is available electronically from the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at Accession No. ML22221A014. Please review the enclosed document carefully, and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III Office at 630-829-9892 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Section 51.22(c).

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys for the prior approved facility diagrams for the 1409 E Virginia St., Evansville, Indiana location of use. Based on its review, the NRC staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material associated with the prior facility diagrams had been removed from the facility and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities, and did not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions, no further remediation or actions are required with respect to previously authorized areas is required; the amended approved floor plan is now in effect.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; or imposition of a civil penalty; or an Order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance that NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's expectations for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
