Scope and Observations: <p>This was an inspection of a hospital authorized to use byproduct material for medical purposes authorized in 35.100, 35.200, 35.300, and 31.11, at its facility in O'Fallon, Missouri. At the time of the inspection, two nuclear medicine technologists (NMTs) performed diagnostic administrations of primarily technetium-99m on 3-7 patients per day Monday through Friday. While the licensee was authorized to administer radiopharmaceuticals that require a written directive, only one administration of iodine-131 occurred since the last inspection. The licensee retained the services of a medical physics consultant to perform instrument and camera quality control and to audit the implementation of the radiation safety program.</p> <p>During the inspection, the inspector toured the licensee's facility to verify licensed material was secured appropriately and performed independent surveys to verify postings were appropriate. The inspector observed an NMT prepare and administer one diagnostic dosage of Tc-99m for a cardiac stress test and observed the NMT demonstrate package receipt procedures and daily instrumentation checks. The inspector also interviewed the NMT regarding written directives, waste handling and disposal, and routine area radiation surveys and contamination wipes. Additionally, the inspector reviewed a selection of records including written directives, patient release documentation, dosimetry records, survey records, and periodic radiation safety program reviews.</p> <p>No violations of NRC requirements were identified as a result of this inspection.</p>
