Perry License Renewal


- The Initial License Renewal Application for the Perry Nuclear Power Plant, Unit 1 was submitted on July 3, 2023 (ML23184A081)
- The current Renewed License expiration date for Perry is November 7, 2026
- If an initial license renewal is granted, it will be for an additional 20 years



Contents of Application


- General information about the plant owner or operator
- Technical information about plant structures and components and how the applicant proposes to manage plant aging
- Environmental Report (ER)

Process Overview



Environmental Review

- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)
 - Informs Federal decision making
 - Public disclosure of environmental impacts and other considerations
- NRC's Environmental Regulations in 10 CFR Part 51
- Staff review is to determine if the environmental impacts of license renewal are so great that license renewal would be unreasonable




Environmental Review (cont.)

- Consider, analyze, and disclose environmental impacts of continued plant operation and alternatives to license renewal
- Identify and assess new and significant information regarding generic conclusions reached in the Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal (LR GEIS)
- Evaluate site-specific issues in a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) to the LR GEIS

Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)

- Staff evaluates impacts to resources
 - Fish and wildlife
 - Water, air, terrestrial resources
 - Historical and cultural resources
 - Socioeconomics
 - Environmental justice
 - Human health
 - Land use

Draft SEIS	August 2024
Draft SEIS Public Meeting	September 2024
Draft SEIS Comment Period Ends	October 2024
Final SEIS	April 2025
License Renewal Decision	May 2025
