On April 17, 2024, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed an Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation (ISFSI) security inspection at the Indian Point Energy Center in Buchanan, New York. The inspection covered the licensee's physical security plan and the October 16, 2002, Interim Compensatory Measures for Dry Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installations Order and was conducted using NRC Inspection Procedure 81311, "Physical Security Requirements for Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installations."

The enclosed inspection report documents the inspection results, which were discussed with Frank Spagnolo, Site Vice President, and other members of your staff, on April 17, 2024.

The inspection examined activities conducted under your license as they relate to security and compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and with the conditions of your license. The inspectors reviewed selected procedures and records, observed activities, and interviewed personnel.

Based on the results of this inspection, one NRC-identified violation of NRC requirements of very low security significance (Severity Level IV) is documented in this report. This violation was evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/pol.html>. Because of the significance and because the issue was entered into your Corrective Action Program (CAP) and the violation was not willful or repetitive, this violation is being treated as a Non-Cited Violation (NCV), consistent with Section 2.3.2 of the NRC Enforcement Policy.
